Transitive verbs

VERB + OBJECT

 When used in active voice, require further information to complete their meaning and are followed by objects

Examples:

I'll have to get a new battery for it.

- <u>Raise</u> your hand if you can hear me.
- <u>Take</u> what you want.
- They make computers.

Examples:

INCOMPLETE

• The shelf holds.

• COMPLETE

The shelf holds three books and a vase of flowers.

INCOMPLETE

• The committee named.

COMPLETE

• The committee **named** a new chairperson.

INCOMPLETE

• The child **broke**.

• COMPLETE

• The child **broke** the plate.

Intransitive verbs

An **intransitive verb**, on the other hand, *cannot* take a direct object:

> The system **has fallen down**. The temperature **dropped**.
